DAC approves proposals worth Rs.7,800 crore

New Delhi, August 24: The Defence Acquisition Council (DAC), which met on August 24 under the chairmanship of Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, accorded Acceptance of Necessity (AoN) for capital acquisition proposals worth approximately Rs.7,800 crore. These include procurement and installation of Electronic Warfare (EW) Suite on Mi-17 V5 Helicopters, ground-based autonomous system for mechanised infantry and armoured regiments, Light Machine Guns (LMG) and Bridge Laying Tanks

"To enhance the efficiency of the Indian Air Force, the DAC has granted AoN for procurement and installation of Electronic Warfare (EW) Suite on Mi-17 V5 Helicopters under Buy (Indian-IDDM) category which will enhance better survivability of Helicopters," a Defence Ministry statement said. The EW Suite will be procured from Bharat Electronics Limited (BEL).

The ground-based autonomous systems for mechanised infantry and armoured regiments will enable various operations like unmanned surveillance, logistic delivery of ammunition, fuel and spares and casualty evacuation on the battlefield, it stated. The Ministry said that while induction of LMG will enhance the



fighting capabilities of infantry forces, the induction of BLT will result in faster movement of Mechanised Forces.

The AoN for procurement of ruggedised laptops and tablets for the Army under Project Shakti has also been approved. All these procurements will be sourced from Indigenous vendors only.

In addition, to enhance the operational capability of the MH-60R Helicopters of the Navy, the DAC has accorded AoN for procurement of weapons for these helicopters. The Navy is currently inducting the MH-60R helicopters, 24 of which were contracted from Lockheed Martin of the US under a \$2.2 bn deal signed during the visit of then U.S. President Donald Trump to India in February 2020.

Mizoram bridge collapse | 23 workers from Bengal feared dead, 18 bodies found



Aizawl, August 24:

Of 26 workers present on the under-construction railway bridge that collapsed in Mizoram's Aizawl district, 23 people are believed to be dead, though the police have recovered only 18 bodies, officials said on August 24. Three of those working there are in hospital and "undergoing treatment" while five are missing, they added.

All the 26 people working there were from Malda district of West Bengal.

The Railways said the accident that took place on August 23 was due to the collapse of a gantry, which was being launched on the under-construction bridge over the Kurung river.

A high-level committee has been constituted to probe the incident involving the underconstruction bridge, one of the 130 bridges in the Bhairavi-Sairang

Railway Line project.

All 18 bodies have been identified. They are Naba Chawdury, Narim Haque, Rahman, Ranjit Sarkar, Kashim Sheikh, Samrul Haque. Jhallu Sarkar, Sakirul Sheikh, Masrekul Haque. Saidur Rahman, Rahim Sheikh, Suman Sarkar Sariful Sheikh, Haque, Jayanta Sarkar, Md Jahidul Sekh, Manirul Nadap

"Five workers are still missing. But chances of their being alive are slim," a

CM YS Jagan releases Rs.216 cr for Left-over **Beneficiaries**

The beneficiaries include 12,405 and 1,630 people found eligible in Jagananna Suraksha and Jaganannaku Chebudam respectively.

While 1,49,875 persons have been added to the pensioners list, Aarogyasri cards, ration cards and house site pattas are being issued to 4327, 2,00,312 and 12,069 eligible people afresh respectively while 94,62,184 persons were issued different certificates after their grievances were solved in Jagananna Suraksha camps.

The number of pensioners went up to 64, 27,090 from 39 lakh in 2019, the pension also has gone up to Rs. 2,750 from Rs.1000, he said, adding that at present, the number of rice cards and Aarogyasri cards stand at 1,48,12,934 and 1,42,15,520 respectively.

In the last four years, 30,84,935 house site pattas were distributed and Rs. 2.33 lakh crore has been transferred directly into the bank accounts of beneficiaries under DBT welfare schemes, he said.

"I am glad that your group is working on the 'High Level Principles for the Digitalisation of Trade Documents'. These principles can help countries in implementing cross-border electronic trade measures, and reduce compliance burdens," he noted.

"I am confident that you will work collectively to ensure that the global trading system gradually transitions into a more representative and inclusive future," Mr. Modi said, concluding his address to Trade Ministers from the G20 nations who are expected to work out a communique over their two-day meet here.

Days after the fresh round of high-level talks, the local commanders of the two militaries held a series of negotiations in two separate locations to resolve issues in Depsang Plains and Demchok.

ISRO Chairman S. Somanath said on Thursday, that the the rover would carry out two important experiments. It has two payloads — the LASER Induced Breakdown Spectroscope (LIBS) and the Alpha Particle X-ray Spectrometer (APXS). The objectives of the LIBS are to conduct qualitative and quantitative elemental analysis and to derive the chemical composition and infer mineralogical composition to further our understanding of the lunar surface.

The APXS will determine the elemental composition of lunar soil and rocks around the landing site.

India became the fourth country to successfully land on the moon as the Chandrayaan-3's lander module, with the rover in its belly, successfully made a soft landing on the lunar surface on Wednesday.

India now on the Moon. What happens to Vikram Lander, Pragyan Rover **after 14 days?**Research Organisation (ISRO) planned Chandrayaan-

3's landing date with the same accuracy and precision that helped them land the 1,752 kg Vikram lander (with the Pragyan rover inside) nearly 400,000 km from Earth. August 23 was the start of one lunar day/night cycle, which was why that date was picked as the landing date. If Vikram failed to touch down on that day, ISRO had a back-up plan - land on August 24. If there was still no touch down (and the lander was undamaged), ISRO reportedly planned to try again 29 days later - after a full day/night cycle on the moon.

Why The Lunar South Pole? Chandrayaan-3 is special as no other spacecraft has been able to achieve a soft landing near the Moon's South Pole. This area - far from the equatorial region targeted by other missions, including NASA's crewed Apollo landings - is full of craters and deep trenches

The findings from the Chandrayaan-3 mission could advance and expand knowledge of lunar water ice, potentially one of the moon's most valuable resources. So What Happens To The Lunar Modules After

Mission Completion? Neither the Vikram lander nor the Pragyan rover will return to Earth - despite what some Indian lawmakers may believe. And neither will the propulsion module

On completion of their respective experiments both the lander and rover will remain on the Moon. They will not be functional during the lunar night and while there is no plan to revive them after that period, ISRO is hopeful both will survive the long night and start up again.

The Chandrayaan-3 Mission

The Rs600 crore-Chandrayaan-3 mission was launched from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Andhra Pradesh's Sriharikota on July 14, piggybacking on a Launch Vehicle Mark-III (LVM-3) rocket. The journey to the Moon took 41 days and, significantly, was completed just days after a Russian spacecraft attempting a similar outcome crashed after spinning out of control.
