Pink ball Test: Starc on his plan behind Jaiswal's first-ball dismissal

ADELAIDE: Australia's pace spearhead Mitchell Starc on Friday said sticking to his go-to mantra of attacking the stumps with the new ball helped him strike early on the opening day of the pink-ball Test against India.

Starc was the standout performer on a lively Adelaide pitch, returning excellent figures of 6/48 to dismiss India for a mere 180 runs.

The 34-year-old dealt an early blow by dismissing young India opener Yashvir Jaiswal leg-before on the first ball of the match, gaining a psychological edge over the visitors' batters right at the beginning.

"At the stumps, hit the pads. That's it. Nothing special," Starc said when asked at the end of the day's play about his plan of action against Perth centurion Jaiswal.

"That's been my role for a while: to attack the stumps and try and make early inroads. Pleased to sneak one past today. We know how important it is to make early inroads into this batting lineup," he said.

"It's always a nice way to start. It is a big Test match, it's a big series."

Jaiswal had scored a century in the opening Test and was also caught on stump mic telling Starc that he was 'too slow' in a playful exchange in Perth. The left-arm pacer said it was satisfying to dismiss Jaiswal for a first-ball duck but cautioned that Australia would need to

remain on their guard in the second innings.

At Perth, Jaiswal had gone for a duck in the first innings but then struck a brilliant 161 in the second to lead India to a 295-run victory.

"He (Jaiswal) had a good Test match last week. So, yeah, nice to get him early. And then we'll have to work on him in the second innings, I guess so," said Starc.

Australia reached 86 for 1 in the final session, leaving the visitors in a spot of bother.

Starc said things couldn't have gone any better for the

hosts on the opening day as they find themselves in a good position.

"Yeah, a very good first day for us with the ball, I think. After that first hour, I think we were pretty bang on. So, yeah, nice way to start the Test, but a nice day one for us. It's a good way to finish the day, or good day all up," said Starc.

Starc also noted that the third session under floodlights was arguably the most challenging for his batters, but praised the efforts of Nathan McSweeney and Marnus Labuschagne, who had done well to see off the

tough conditions.

Despite unsettling spells from Jasprit Bumrah and Harshit Rana, Australian opener McSweeney (38 not out) and Labuschagne (28 not out) were at the crease when stumps were called.

"Arguably the hardest time to bat is that third session with the brand new pink ball. To finish the day one down, particularly from Marnus and McSweeney there to fight through that and obviously sustain pressure from a quality bowling attack... and to come out the other end with a chance

to go on tomorrow.

"It was fantastic from them. So, yeah, very pleased from there," added Starc.

Starc felt that Test cricket had changed somewhat since the time he came into the Australian side with a lot of young, talented and fearless cricketers emerging from the Indian Premier League and making an impact in Test cricket.

"Yeah, the game's changed. The game's allowed to change. I guess that's partly the T20 era, isn't it?"

"Some of these guys come up, grow up through IPL cricket and there's no fear or there's the expectation to be very good from the get-go and they're quality players from the time they get into international cricket no matter what their age is," he said.

Bhuvneshwar, Hazlewood excited to be back at RCB

BENGALURU: Veteran Indian seamer Bhuvneshwar Kumar and Australian pacer Josh Hazlewood have expressed their excitement at returning to Royal Challengers Bengaluru ahead of the next edition of IPL.

Both players were picked by RCB at the mega auction last month in Riyadh.

Bhuvneshwar, who began his IPL journey with RCB in 2009, is looking forward to shoulder the team's bowling responsibilities for the first time since he started playing in the league.

"Really happy to be part of RCB, it's where I started in 2009. I want to thank RCB management for considering me and a big shout out to the RCB fans for showing so much love. Looking forward to a great season," said Bhuvneshwar in a release.

For Hazlewood, his previous stint with RCB was during the COVID pandemic, when matches were not played in Bangalore.

Despite this, he left a lasting impression, taking 23 wickets in 15 games at an economy of 8.26.

Brook's century has England on top after Day 1 of the 2nd Test against NZ

WELLINGTON: Harry Brook played the role of New Zealand's nemesis with flair on Friday, reaching his eighth test century as England finished in a strong position after the first day of the second test.

Brook's fast-paced innings of 123 included a century from 91 balls and set the tempo of a day on which 346 runs were scored and 15 wickets fell.

New Zealand finished in trouble at 86-5 in reply to England's 280, having lost Devon Conway, Tom Latham, Rachin Ravindra, Kane Williamson and Daryl Mitchell before stumps.

Tom Blundell was 6 not out and nightwatchman Will O'Rourke was unbeaten on 0. Williamson appeared typically solid until he was caught by wicketkeeper Ollie Pope

from the bowling of Brydon Carse for 37.

Carse had bowled Williamson when he was 20 only to be denied when replays showed he had over-stepped.

Brook made the difference in the first test which England won by eight wickets, going to the crease at 45-3 and making 171 to deliver a commanding first-innings lead.

INDIAN SUPER LEAGUE Chennaiyin look to break Kolkata jinx

CHENNAI: Chennaiyin FC will look to end their two-match winless run when they lock horns with East Bengal FC in their Indian Super League match here on Saturday.

Both teams will aim to strengthen their campaigns in this crucial match.

East Bengal FC, sitting at the bottom of the table with four points from eight games,

recently ended a seven-game winless run this season with a 1-0 victory over NorthEast United FC.

Meanwhile, Chennaiyin FC are ninth in the standings, having earned 12 points from 10 games. They will look to end their two-game losing streak and revive their fortunes with the support of their home crowd standing staunchly behind them. Chennaiyin FC have lost their last two ISL games against Kolkata-based sides by identical 0-1 scorelines.

Gukesh, Liren eye breakthrough after series of draws

SINGAPORE: Half a dozen draws and some missed opportunities later, sprightly challenger D Gukesh and resolute defending champion Ding Liren would be desperate for a breakthrough when they clash in the 10th game of the World Chess Championship here on Saturday.

Gukesh has explored several winning lines but the advantage has not translated into victories for the Indian, and with just five more classical games left to be played in the USD 2.5 million prize money championship, the 18-year-old would look to break the deadlock and hope to take a decisive lead after a day's rest on Friday.

The draw on Thursday, which was the seventh of the match and sixth on the trot, has left both players on an identical score of 4.5 points each, still three shy of the championship-winning tally.

The 32-year-old Liren had won the opening game while Gukesh had emerged victorious in the third All other games have ended in draws.

If history is anything to go by, the reigning champion wins the match if the scores are tied 4-4 after eight games which was the case here too.

The Chennai-born Indian knows that he will have to punch hard against his gritty Chinese opponent, who has a habit of coming up with well-disguised tricks when the chips are down.

World number one and five-times world champion Magnus Carlsen minced no words while doing a recap of the ninth game and said that the time was running out for Gukesh.
